PATRICIA ANN COLE (Patty), daughter of the late Joseph and Evelyn Washington, was born September 30, 1950, in Baltimore, Maryland. She departed this life on January 20, 2014, after a brief illness. Patty received her education from the Baltimore City Public School System and was a graduate of Paul Laurence Dunbar High School.

Patty married Tyrone Johnson, February 11, 1967. Two children were born out this union, Darlene Johnson and Tyrone Charles Johnson Jr., who preceded her in death. She later married Rickey J. Cole, January 24, 1989. That union was blessed with the adoption of Dayvon W. Jones.

Patty saw educational opportunities as a lifelong pursuit. She taught us "Works" by Henry Van Dyke and "Learn to do Better" through sharing her life experiences as an example to encourage others to better themselves. Additional loves were music, modeling and poetry. Her poetry was compiled into her book "Heartaches of a Mother" written in memorial to her late son (Tyrone Charles Johnson Jr).

Patty was a member of Mt. Pleasant Church and Ministries and loved the Lord, declaring Him her Lord and Savior.

Her work career included employment at Stella Maris Hospice - 15 years, Charlestown Nursing Home and Johns Hopkins Hospital.

She leaves to mourn: her husband, Rickey J. Cole; her two surviving children, Darlene Carter and Dayvon Jones; one grandson, Martez D. Carter; two grand-daughters, Cheyenne Johnson and Shabriel Carter; one great-grandson, Martez D. 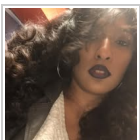
