Patricia Ann Madison was born on March 23, 1945 to Daniel and Lola Gault in Baltimore, Maryland. She attended Baltimore City Public Schools, and later received a Masters of Human Services degree from Lincoln University in Oxford, Pennsylvania.

Patricia was a devoted Christian who had a great love for people. Throughout her 39 years of professional teaching and counseling, Patricia worked tirelessly to share God's love by serving others. She was ordained a minister in 1994, and co-founded the Restoration for the Family Church. She later served as Chaplain Assistant for the Anne Arundel General Hospital in Annapolis, Maryland. Many young girls benefited tremendously from her counseling services at the Thomas J. Waxter Children's Center. In 2012, Patricia retired from the YWCA as a Child Therapist.

For many years, Patricia fellowshipped at Infinity Church in Laurel, Maryland, where she started several outreach programs. During the last years of her life, she found peace and contentment among her church family at Antioch. There also, her faith in God and her passion for winning souls for Christ was an inspiration to all who knew her.

"Pat" or "Tricia" as she was lovingly known to many, married Timothy

Holt, Sr. (deceased) in 1961. That union produced three children: Timothy Holt, Jr., Patricia Yvette Holt-Blackstone, and Terri Lynn Holt. A subsequent marriage to Lawrence Madison ended in 1978.
