Pat worked for Genesis as a RN floor nurse for a short period of time, then worked for Future Care where she found her work family and worked for them for MANY YEARS. Starting at Sandtown Winchester and then to Charles Village as a DON. She became an Educator at Irvington for ALL Future Care facilities. She retired from Future Care Coldspring in 2017 after being a nurse

for over 45 years.

Pat LOVED her family and would do anything for any of them. She believed in getting things done and that was her way of showing you she loved you.

Pat was preceded by her father Rev. David Taylor Tomlin Sr., one sister Brenda Tomlin, one granddaughter Monteia Carter and one great-granddaughter Unique Wise.
