Dr. Patrick Enekwe Sr. was born in Kanfanchan, Nigeria, on March 18th, 1953 to Nigerian Railway train conductor Alfred & Catherine (nee Okereke) Enekwe. He passed away on March 24th, 2026, at the age of 73 in Baltimore, Maryland. Patrick attended St. Augustine Secondary School, Nkwerre, Imo State in Nigeria. He came to the U.S. in 1979 as a college student at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska and graduated in 1984, gaining a bachelor's degree in pharmacy. He attended University of Maryland, from where he received his Doctorate of Pharmacy in 1998.

He moved to Baltimore in 1985 to join Rite-Aid as a community retail pharmacist and would go on to serve the Baltimore community as a pharmacist for close to 40 years.
