Subsequently, he was employed by Baltimore City Gas & Electric Co. as a technical electrician for street lights and later at Turn Key as a laborer. Pat accepted Christ at an early age at his mother's church, Christ at Love, Faith and Deliverance Church of Christ. He continued to renew that commitment at many churches he visited.
