



## Patsey "Pat" Johnson

June 1, 1919 - December 26, 2020

PATSY JANE McLEAN JOHNSON, affectionately known as Ms. Pat or Aunt Pat, peacefully slipped away (with a smile on her face) and entered into eternal rest on Saturday, December 26, 2020. Patsy was born to the late Dixon and Mandy Jane McPhatter McLean in Robeson County, on June 1, 1919 (although she always celebrated her birthday on April 12). At an early age, Patsy accepted Christ as her personal Savior and joined Island Grove Missionary Baptist Church. She received her education in the public schools of Robeson County. At a young age Pat relocated to Durham, NC to get a better job; where she met her husband the late Mr. Willie E. Johnson. Shortly thereafter, they relocated to Baltimore, Maryland for better job opportunities. Ms. Pat became a faithful member of the Southern Baptist Church. She was involved in many auxiliaries and received many Merit awards for her outstanding services and dedication to her church. She loved to usher and led the line with focus and favor. She served as an usher for over 55 years and was one of the oldest ushers and members of her church up until the Covid-19 pandemic. Ms. Pat worked as a cook and a housekeeper for Doctors and Lawyers. They

always treated her like a family member, even after she retired.

One of Aunt Pat's favorite colors was blue and her favorite football team was the Baltimore Ravens. On January 8, 2020, she received an official letter from the Ravens recognizing her as being a loyal fan.

Aunt Pat also loved to bake cakes and pies for her family. She made the best chocolate cakes and sweet potato pies. Two of her favorite foods were fried chicken and crab cakes. She loved to travel. Some of her

favorite places to visit were Las Vegas, Bahamas, Mexico, New Orleans, Puerto Rico and Florida. She

often traveled by car to North Carolina with her great-niece (Joyce) and great-great-nieces (Shanae and

Shanell). Aunt Pat loved to spend time with her family; especially during the Christmas holidays and

family reunions. On August 26, 2018, Aunt Pat attended the Big M's 54th Family Reunion. She received

the John Q. McIntosh Legacy Award for being the oldest cousin in attendance.

In 2019 when Aunt Pat turned 100 years old, she was recognized with a Mayoral Salute Award from the

Mayor of Baltimore City. In that same month Aunt Pat was also recognized by the North Carolina House

of Representatives as being one of the oldest persons from Robeson County.

Pat was preceded in death by her father, Dixon; mother, Mandy Jane; five brothers, John Willie, Dixon

Jr., Billy, King David and Frank; five sisters, Janie Bell, Lula Mae, Rebecca, Mary Lee and Margaret Lee.

Her loving memory will be cherished by her family and friends; her special niece, Debbie (who she

considered her daughter); three sister-in-laws, Wilhelmina McLean, Annie

Neal McLean and Betty

McLean; and a host of nieces, nephews, great nieces, great nephews, great-great nieces, great-great nephews, cousins, other relatives, friends and her Southern Baptist Church Family; God-daughter, Reverend Mary
