She died April 20, 2007 after a long illness. She is predeceased by her parents; brother, Charles Wiley, and her sister, Barbara Wiley. At an early age, she was active in her church, serving as the pianist for the Sunday School, Sunday School teacher and actress in many dramas and plays. She also wrote school plays that were represented. Mrs. Brown received her Bachelor's Degree from Knoxville College, Knoxville, Tennessee and her Master's Degree from Virginia State University. She continued her graduate studies at the University of Richmond and Virginia Commonwealth University. Mrs. Brown joined Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. at Knoxville College and served as its President during her junior and senior years. She was also President of the YWCA campus organization. She married her husband, an active military officer in May of 1965 and traveled extensively in the continental United States and Europe. She worked as an elementary teacher in Prince George's County, MD and Lawton, Oklahoma. Her first job after college was as the Adult Program Director of the West End YWCA in Louisville, KY. She was also the American Pre-School Director in Baumholder, Germany. Mrs. Brown held a variety of jobs in Richmond Public Schools including classroom teacher, Title I Reading Teacher, Teacher Specialist and finally after 30 years retiring on June 30, 2006 as Assistant Principal of Woodville Elementary School. Pansy, Mrs. Brown's mother wanted Patsy to be

classical pianist. She put her energy, encouragement, and sacrifices for advanced piano lessons in place. Patsy became an efficient pianist but her talent was in other areas. Her mother would be delighted to know that her grandson, Christopher is a classical guitarist and her granddaughter played the violin very well. She loved to write and hoped to finish a volume of work detailing her family's history since slavery. She loved music especially classical works and traveled often for concerts of major artists. Traveling was also a passion and her family spent most summers on the road. Mrs. Brown enjoyed life to the fullest. She is survived by her devoted and loving husband of 42 years, Isaiah Brown, Jr.; a daughter Ingram D. Brown, Akron, Ohio; two sons, Isaiah Brown III, of Glen Allen, VA, and Christopher R. Brown, of Richmond, VA. She is also survived by one sister, Mary Stewart, of Cincinnati, OH; one brother, Walter Wiley and wife, Shirley, of Suitland, MD; one sister-in-law, Patricia Van Ness and husband, Cedric of Richmond; several nieces and nephews, two devoted, Patsy Renée Wiley, of Washington, DC and Sidney Jackson, of Suitland, MD. She also leaves behind a host of first cousins, other relatives, friends, and the family pet, Page. Mrs. Brown was devoted to her family and her work as an educator, and she will be missed by all.
