Pattie Louise Karim was born June 25, 1925. She peacefully departed this life on January 15, 2007 at the age of 81. Pattie Louise was one of ten children born to the union of Maria and Robert Vincent in Littleton, North Carolina. She moved to Baltimore in 1945. Pattie met Nathaniel Karim and they were joined in matrimony on October 7, 1947. From this union seven children were born. Pattie Karim, “MaMa” as she was fondly called was a happy homemaker who loved children and helped raise all of her grandchildren. In 1953, she followed her husband and joined the Nation of Islam. She was one of the first pioneers that helped establish Islam in Baltimore. She served on the Welcome Committee and the Sick and Shut-in Committee. MaMa loved people. She worked in the kitchen, cooking and preparing dinners. She was known for her famous egg pies. In 1975 she made the transition from the Nation of Islam and was a devoted follower of Iman Warith Deen Muhammad until her death. She leaves to cherish her memories – loving husband of fifty-nine years, Nathaniel; seven children; Rasul (Rashida), Nathaniel Jr, (Marsha), Roslyn (Siraj), Raymond (Eleanora), Sonia, Emmanuel and Cheryl; seventeen grandchildren: Quanita, Darric, Malcolm, Marvin, Sahah, Shawki, Ayana, Shahidah, Saleem, Anwar, Natalie, Sakinah, Aaron, Siraj, Samir, Mariah and Michaelia; and nineteen great-grandchildren all of Baltimore, Maryland.
