Paul Andrew Colbert was born on November 30, 1965 to Mary Colbert Middleton in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life suddenly on September 11, 2014.

He received his education in Catholic schools here in Baltimore starting with St. Ann Elementary, St. Matthew Middle School and he graduated from Archbishop Curley High School. He also attended Morgan State University for two years.

Paul (or “Pete the Plumber” as he was affectionately called) took an after school job at a plumbing company while in college. This started his love for plumbing. He worked for several companies mostly doing utility plumbing most of his life. At his passing he worked for Ariosa & Company. He would tackle any kind of job. If he didn't know how to fix something, he'd get a manual and teach himself.

Paul had one son, Paul II born August 18, 1988. In 1996 he met the love of his life, Sharon L. Brogden. They were married three years later in 1999. Paul was a mason, a legionnaire and a member of Elks Monumental Lodge #3.

Pete was a light-hearted, happy-go-lucky person, always smiling, laughing and joking. Everywhere he went he made friends. Some of his favorite

expressions were, "I never meet a stranger", "Make it do what it do" and "Let's go with that". He will be greatly missed.
