Paul attended Paul Lawrence Dunbar Junior/Senior High School. During his twelfth year, he enlisted in the military during WWII, because he missed his older brother “King” who was in the service. Upon the conclusion of WWII, Paul returned to Baltimore and completed high school at Douglass High School, Veterans Branch. After graduating from Douglass, he went on to attend Morgan State College where he completed one year. Paul was reactivated to military service during the Korean Conflict. Paul was a stickler for speaking properly. He was always correcting people. It didn’t matter who it was. If you spoke poorly, he would correct you. He loved making friends. He talked to everyone he came in contact with. He was also a history buff, especially world history and black history. Paul went around the world only to come back home to marry the girl across the street, Delores Bowser. This union was blessed with nine children. Paul worker for U.S. Postal Service for 38 years. He retired in 1985. During his years at the Post Office, he worked part-time at BWI and the Yellow Cab Company to support his large family. Three years after retiring from the Post Office, he worked as a driver for Roland Park Florist. As a child, Paul attended Asbury Methodist Episcopal Church and Hoffman Street Methodist Episcopal Church. After retiring, he rededicated himself to the Lord at Christ United Methodist Church. He became very active in the church as a member of the Finance Committee,

Trustee Committee, United Methodist Men, men's bible study and soup kitchen. Paul was a Prince Hall Mason. Paul was family man. He was very close to his children, grandchildren, sister and brothers, his very dear companion, and extended family. He was lovingly known as daddy, granddaddy, grandfather, pop-pop, and poppy. Paul was preceded in death by his wife, Delores.
