Pauline was the oldest of eleven children. She was married to the late Joe Lane. She was a loving and kindhearted person, who opened her heart and home to everyone she came in contact with. She worked for over 30 years doing domestic work for the late William and Mary Benedict until her retirement in 2004, due to her failing health. Prior to working for the Benedict family, Pauline worked in housekeeping at the Duchess House and later became assisted chef at the Holiday Inn. Pauline was a faithful member of Grace Memorial Baptist Church, where she served as a Deaconess, under the leadership of Dr. Rev. Alfred CD Vaughn. She later moved her membership to New Jerusalem Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Mamie Cooley and attended services regularly until her health began to fail. After moving back to North Carolina in 2007, she attended Deliverance Temple Word of Faith Christian Center under the leadership of Bishop O.T. and Mother Annie Johnson in Fayetteville, North Carolina.
