Pauline Hester Mason, daughter of the late Lanzie and Hugh Hogue, was born on June 28, 1941, in Yonkers, New York. She departed this life on May 29th, 2018 after a lengthy illness.

Pauline was the youngest of eight close-knit children. Her seven siblings, Kelsey, Isham (Ikey), Jeanette, Thurman, Rose, Charles, and Ronald, all preceded her in death.

She was educated in the Yonkers Public School System and was an avid reader during her early years.

Pauline married Wilbert Mason, Sr. on February 14, 1959, the love of her life. From that union four children were born, Leah Mason (Grant) and Wilbert Mason, Jr. Her two children, William Mason and Sandra Mason (Brooks), preceded her in death.

She later served as a facilitator of the Baltimore Summer Corp Program in her community and moved on to City Hall where she retired as a Senior Constituent Aid for the Baltimore City Council.

Pauline was a faithful servant of God and became a member of the Second Antioch Baptist Church, where all of her grandchildren were baptized. The members always stayed close to her heart. She later joined the Blessed Baptist Church where she became an Ordained Deaconess and served until she became ill. She was a member of the choir and known for her beautiful rendition of "Yes God is Real" and her duet with her husband, "May the Work I've Done." She loved her time in Church, especially when sitting next to her dear friend, Mother Blanche.

Pauline, was fiercely protective of her family, and had a hand—sometimes two, in raising her grandchildren, along with loving, caring and spoiling her great-grandchildren. She made sure every one of her relatives felt like they were her favorite. Her heart was "pure enough" and "big enough" to make that possible. She was honest and straight to the point. In typical Hogue fashion, you never had to question what she meant.

Along with her nieces and nephews who migrated to Baltimore, "Priss Tail", as she was affectionately called by her eldest brother, Kelsey, kept a very close relationship with her nieces and nephews in New York, who always supported her. She enjoyed anything that involved her family, and was provided excellent, loving care by her beloved husband, Deacon Mason. Pauline lived for them and she will forever be remembered as the heart of our family. She will always be with us.
