Pazzaro was surrounded by abundant love and care from family and friends before his untimely passing.

He was raised in Trenton, New Jersey where he spent his childhood and formative years. Charles was baptized and faithfully worshipped at the First Antioch Church of the Lord in Trenton.

From an early age, Pazzaro was known for his intelligence and never let anything get in the way of his education. His formal elementary and secondary education was received at Monument Elementary School, Jr. High School #5, and Central High School in Trenton. Charles graduated with honors and was accepted into Rutgers University. While attending Rutgers, Pazzaro was a longstanding member of the Liberated Gospel Choir. He loved to sing! In the Spring of 1980, he became an Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.- Delta Iota Chapter member. Joining the fraternity was one of Charles' proudest moments. He loved the lifelong bond he and his line brothers share.

Pazzaro graduated from Rutgers University, Magna Cum Laude (the highest academic achievement). He was awarded the Edward Bloustein Fellowship to

complete Graduate Studies and earn his Master's in one year. Shortly after entering the MSW Program, Pazzaro put his studies on hold and relocated to Washington, D.C.

After working and living in the DC/MD area for many years, Charles decided to make Baltimore "Charm City" his forever home. He loved this city for its rich heritage, culture, arts, and strong sense of community that he became a part of. Additionally, Charles was a die-hard sports fan. He watched them religiously. He was one of the Ravens' #1 fans!

In his professional life, Pazzaro had a tremendous positive impact on the people he served in the workplace. He dedicated his career to uplifting individuals with substance abuse, domestic violence, and other social issues. Mr. Charles was credentialed and highly sought after in the Baltimore non-profit industry. Cited his experience, expertise, and innate ability to connect with others, he was well respected by all his program participants and staff.

Pazzaro made it his personal goal to demonstrate what caring and compassion truly mean. A people's advocate. He was employed at the Recovery Center of Maryland and several other agencies. In his last position, Pazzaro served as the Manager of Intake and Assessment. He dedicated his life to uplifting others dealing with life challenges.

Pazzaro Charles Bright was predeceased by his biological mother, Mildred Bright; and adoptive parents; Hazel and Luther Colvin. He leaves to mourn: his father, David W.
