Peggy was employed with William Baumgarten Company of Baltimore, Maryland, from 1972-2002 where she was an office manager. Peggy loved to travel and enjoyed life. Favorite past times were maintaining a beautiful and welcoming home, and spending time with close friends. She also loved to be with her grandchildren and provided love, guidance, and support. Peggy departed this life suddenly on November 25, 2005, after having suffered a massive stroke. She also is survived by three sisters: Sandra K. Day of Chicago, IL; Mary Catherine Whitaker of Angola, IN; and Deborah Ashay Day of Fremont, CA. Also surviving are four brothers: John R.
