Persylla Davis Feaster, affectionately known as “Feet”, was born on November 6, 1933 in Sumter, South Carolina to the late Eddie and Cassie Davis. The fourth daughter, she was preceded in death by six sisters, Esther Davis, Mattie Corbett, Vemease Davis, Ruth Frierson, Rosa Lee Hampton, and Marie Player. She received her formal education in Sumter County and graduated from Congruity Parochial School Class of 1951.

She confessed Christ at an early age and was baptized into the Mulberry Baptist Church family in Sumter. In 1956, Persylla relocated to Baltimore, MD and later joined the Southern Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Rev. James R. Grant. She loved to attend Sunday school and looked forward to the Church-wide Institute every year. Persylla loved to sing the gospel and was a longtime member of the former Senior Choir #2, Coel Chorus, Men & Women's Day choir, and the Mass Choir. In addition, she saw to it that they all completed their formal education and went to church every Sunday including weeknight services. She maintained a Christian home-where family and friends were always welcome.
