He loved teaching Sunday school where he once served as assistant superintendent. Phillip loved to sing. He was a member of the Male Chorus, and the St. James Inspirational and Vocal Choirs. He was also a member of the Building Fund and Pastor's Aide. Phillip met the former Edna Gray in 1981 and after many years of friendship, they were united in marriage on July 1, 1995. There were no children from this union. Phillip was a devoted husband, father, son, brother, and friend. He was affectionately known as "Junior," "Phil," and his friends called him "Snow".
