PRENTISS LEON COX, affectionately known to all as Jabbo, was born to Georgia Francis Cox and the late Puber Lee Cox in Washington, North Carolina on February 6, 1943. He departed his life on January 24, 2009, after a brief illness. Prentiss received his education in the Baltimore City public schools. As a young man, Prentiss loved to play basketball at Knox Church and play pool at the poolroom on Gay Street. Whenever you wanted him, just go to the poolroom and he would be right there. That stopped somewhat when he married his childhood sweetheart Georgia Ross-Cox on May 23, 1962.
