PRESTON J. DAVIS SR., was born in Columbia, South Carolina on June 8, 1920, the youngest, son of Lee Davis Jr. and Amanda Benson Davis. Preston grew up in a household where Christian values were its foundation. He departed this life on October 22, 2005, at Maryland General Hospital. He endured and courageously fought a long illness.
