Matinde “Prince” Evans was born in Morrisiana Hospital in the Bronx, New York on February 20, 1937. He joined the Ancestors on December 10, 2004. Matinde attended George Washington High School. Bro. Matinde joined the African Nationalist Pioneer Movement in 1959 under the leadership of the Hon. Carlos A. Cooks. Brother Matinde was sincere, dedicated, loyal and committed to the cause of African Nationalism for the past 40 years. He was committed to the practice of RACE FIRST. Brother Matinde devoted his physical energy, private fortune and sacred honor towards the struggle to uplift his RACE. Brother Matinde was a Legionaire. Brother Matinde stood firm against obstacles and was a benevolent Afrikan Warrior. He pioneered and was the first to acquire land in Daressalaam Tanzania, Africa. Brother Matinde was founder and builder of the Hon. Carlos A. Cooks and the Hon. Herbert Coleman Cultural School, Uhuru Computer Institute and the Irving Manigault School of Technology in Tanzania, Africa. Brother Matinde leaves to cherish his memory, ten children, Kimathi and (Rhonda) Evans, Matinde Evans, Ravonne and (Clarence) Douglas, Prince H. Evans, III, Phillip and (Jacqueline) McKenzie, Twana Adams, Ruth Allen Evans, Julia W. Evans, Prince Ngoga Evans and Vernhenri Bekate Evans. He has three sisters and brothers-in-law; Drs.
