Quinn Willis, son of the late Ed and Lillie Willis, was born December 4, 1921 in Wilkes County, Georgia. On the evening of June 12, 2005 he was quietly called home to eternal rest at Good Samaritan Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland after a brief illness. Quinn is one of seventeen children, twelve of whom preceded him in death, eleven brothers and one sister. He was educated in the Wilkes County public school system. He served briefly in the Civilian Conservation Corps, which came to be known as the (CCC) in the late 1930's. At an early age he joined the Pole Branch Baptist Church and attended church regularly with his family. In the early 1940's he relocated to Baltimore. He then joined the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church and later the First Mt. Olive Freewill Baptist Church where he served on the Board of Trustees. He served faithfully until his health began to fail. He was married to the former Lavonia Hill for sixty-one years and from that union one child was born, Robert Lee Willis, who preceded him in death. He was employed at Changes Enterprises, Ltd., formerly Seif's men's clothing store, for sixty years. He leaves to cherish his memory: a loving and devoted wife, Lavonia Hill Willis; great-granddaughter, Carlene Lewis; two sisters, Lue Bell Willis of Athens, Ga. and Melve Willis McDowell of Atlanta, Ga.; two brothers, Dan Jonas Willis and Walter Neal Willis (Pauline) of Athens, Ga.; sisters-in-law, Beatrice Anderson of Atlanta, Ga., Johnnie Mae Hill of Decatur, Ga., Josephine Hill of Washington, Ga., Cinnamon Andrews and Ida V. Andrews (Marion) of Tignall, Ga.; brother-in-law, James Hill (Annie) of Baltimore, Md.; nieces, nephews,
