Quinton Dale Powell, Sr., was the son of Margaret Reed and Willard Powell; born July 9, 1958, in Baltimore, Maryland. He was raised in Lafayette Homes and was most known as "Cooper" by his family, friends and co-workers. Cooper was educated in Baltimore City Public Schools. He attended Charles Carroll of Carrollton Elementary School #139 and Lombard Junior High. Cooper graduated from Paul Lawrence Dunbar Senior High School and was a member of the wrestling team at the McKim Recreation Center in Old Town. Cooper was employed at the Maryland Cup Company after graduating high school, however he also had a natural talent for cutting hair which he began to perfect early in his youth. Cooper was most proud of his accomplishment of fulfilling his goal of attending barbering school. He received his Master Barber license from Ron Thomas Barbering School and worked at Virgo's Barber Shop and Flair Hair (both in the Old Town Mall). Cooper was "always" at the shop sunup to sundown and in the early days past midnight. He perfected the art of being an "on-call" professional and had a passion for always being self-sufficient. Cooper loved barbering so much and he loved taking his children to work with him. He may have been the founder of the "take your child to work" mindset. He knew that the more time you spend with your children, the more you can impart your fatherly guidance and wisdom upon them (even your daughters)! He enjoyed freedom and flexibility and his barbering career was a dream come true. Cooper was an anchor to this family and anyone could call him. No matter if

he was early or right on time he always brought life and love into any room he entered. He loved being silly and joking with this family and friends, even if the joke was on him.

Cooper was resourceful, always thinking of creative ways to be self-sufficient; he purchased a snowball machine that afforded the children another avenue to work as a family creating many memorable moments over a cool and refreshing treat. He always recommended egg custard snowballs but his favorite flavor was banana. Cooper's fun-loving nature allowed him to easily capture the heart of all his friends and family. He always took time to take his children bike riding, roller skating, duckpin bowling and to the park. He always came home with all types of treats from Jeppi's and Northeast Market just to see their smiles.

It was in the third grade that Cooper met Mary. There was just something about hi that Mary couldn't shake and from there they built their bond. In high school Cooper traveled all around Baltimore City with her to visit libraries just to complete term history. Cooper was extremely proud to be a father to his three children.

His first born "Danielle or "Dan" as he loved to call her as a child is certainly a daddy's girl. She innately obtained Cooper's bubbly and outgoing personality along with the love and art of hair styling. As she got older the bond was only strengthened but as time went on the roles reversed. The duo went from him taking care of her to her taking care of him and because of this Cooper gave her the new nickname of "Mother Dear".

Cooper's second daughter Michelle or "BuBs" as he nicked named her for always wearing big round ponytail boilies in her hair. Being the skilled barber that he was, he had to be the first person to arch Michelle's eyebrows for her very first junior prom! They shared a love for orange soda, peppermint candies, and photoshoots.

Like every man, Cooper was extremely proud when his son was born. Of course he was going to be a junior and had to be stamped with the nick name of "Mr. C". He couldn't wait to give his son his very first cut as well as teaching

him barbering techniques and tips of the trade to always have a life long hustle and skill.

Taylor who is Cooper's first and only grandchild, who nick named him "PopPop". They were attached at the hip at first sight. He enjoyed taking care of her and teaming up together to joke on her mother after their yearly snowball fights until their hands and feet were numb.

Cooper loved city and loved taking the children to all of the cultural attractions such as the Great Blacks in Wax Museum beginning at the original location on Saratoga Street, the Shot Tower and the Inner Harbor. As an East Baltimore native, he loved fresh fish, corned beef, pineapple soda and bean pies!

Cooper loved listening to Roy Ayers, Frankie Beverly and Maze, WARR and jazz!

Cooper's health failed after a stroke on his 64th birthday. God blesse us with the opportunity to be at his side. His children honored their father by being with him in the ICU 24/7. After one week of intensive care Cooper transitioned on July 17, 2022. He is always with us, in our hearts. We cherish all the memories God allowed us, his "Mr. Cool" tams (never Kango), his signature handy toothpicks, peppermints and the full love of life!

Cooper lived a full life, leaving a long lasting impression on anyone he met. While we believe his time was cut short, we will remain anchored in the belief that God knows best. No longer limited by the body. Cooper's legacy will continue to be an illuminated path for us to follow and to continue. He dedicated himself to being there for whomever needed him whenever they needed him.

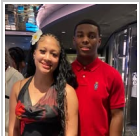
