February 2, 1930 - September 23, 2003

Randolph Benson Green, the son of the late Mr. Naudain V. Green and Mrs. Ella L. Green Booze was born in Baltimore, Maryland on February 2, 1930. He entered eternity on September 23, 2003 at the Loch Raven Veterans Hospice. Randolph, affectionately known as “Bunny,” was educated in the public schools of this city. He was employed as a maintenance worker at several area businesses, including The Hub and The Sun Life Insurance Company. Bunny also worked in the family-owned restaurant Marvin’s on Pennsylvania Avenue, next door to the old Royal Theatre. He often told of how the famous performers would drop by for dinner after the show. Randolph was honorably discharged from the United States army after serving his country faithfully for ten years. He will be remembered as a kind and giving man who loved his family. He was generous to a fault. Some of Bunny’s happiest memories were holiday times he spent at his Aunt Sissy and Uncle Eddie’s, Baby and Niecy’s homes and his daily telephone chats with his beloved Aunt Doris. It was his “Baby” that cared for him until the very end. He also loved animas. Any stray cat or dog could find a home at his house. Randolph was led by his cousin and Pastor, Reverend Ronald C. Howard, Sr. to make the most important decision of his life in 1999. He accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior and Lord. He reaffirmed his commitment before witnesses on September 13, 2003.
