Randolph William Lee, the son of the late Rebecca and Bartley Lee, was born September 16, 1919 in Essex, Virginia. As a young child, Randolph and his family came to Baltimore where he attended Baltimore City Public Schools. As soon as he could, he went to work to take care of himself and to help his mother. In 1942, Randolph joined the United States Army. After three years of service and an honorable discharge from the Army, he met and married Alice Virginia Dean. From this marriage there were five children: Paula, Warren, Kevin and Gregory Lee and David Dean, a stepson. Randolph worked for twenty-two years at the Veterans Administration Hospital as a first class Chef. Then, after retirement from the VA Hospital in 1971, Randolph was still full of energy and ambition, so he began working part-time at the Orioles games in Memorial Stadium of Baltimore City. Randolph had a strong spiritual life. During the early years, he attended St. Paul Free Will Baptist Church. In 1967, he became a founding member of the Emmanuel Free Will Baptist Church. He served with devotion and dedication as church treasurer and trustee. His kindness and love for people will be missed. He had a great sense of humor. He always had a story for every occasion. His favorite expression for everyone was "slicker." He leaves to cherish their memories: two children, Paula Lee McDonald and Kevin William Lee; one son-in-law, Antonio McDonald; daughter-in-law, Angela Marie Lee; brother, James E.
