Reese I. Price Jr. was born on May 9, 1927 to the late Reese and Mary Ruth Price. He was the second of nine siblings: five brothers and three sisters. His three brothers, Benjamin, Harold and Louis Price preceded him in death. Reese was his birth name, however, by many of his relatives he was known as "Hotsy." Reese received his education in the Anne Arundel County School System. On October 9, 1950 Reese was drafted into the United States Army, where he fought in the Korean War until September 5, 1952. On January 31, 1953 Reese was united in marriage to Gladys Terry. From this union four children were born: the late Reese Price, the late Dwayne Price, Craig Price and Ronald Price. Reese was a very loving, caring devoted father and husband. In 1954, Reese joined the staff of Bethlehem Steel. He was employed as a "Machine Operator," for over 20 years. During his tour of duty at Bethlehem Steel, Reese became an active member of Local 2610 Steelworkers' Union. Reese will be remembered as one who enjoyed life. He enjoyed fishing, hunting and spending quality time with his two grandchildren, both of which he truly adored. In March 1954 Reese accepted the Lord as his personal Savior and joined The First Baptist Church. On May 18, 2002 at 4:00 am Reese entered God's Glorious Garden after a lengthy battle with diabetes and coronary artery disease.
