Reginald L. Koromah Sr., the son of the late George and Cornelia Koromah, was born on April 2, 1946. Five years after having an intracerebral hemorrhagic stroke, the Lord called him to rest on August 10, 2023 at the age of 77.

Reginald was educated in Baltimore, Maryland. He married Ernestine Dunton and had four children in their 20 years of marriage. He took care of his family as he worked at Coca-Cola Company for a number of years and finished his working years at Stieff Silver.

He was raised as a devoted Catholic. Later in his adult life he accepted the Commandments of God in Jesus Christ. He and his family became members of the Philadelphia Church of Christ. Later, he became a member of Gethsemane Spiritual Temple followed by his own independent church studies. He spent a great deal of time studying and discussing end-time prophecy including the coming of Christ.

He enjoyed all types of music and was an avid album collector. He even owned every Motown record that was recorded. His jazz collection is still intact. He enjoyed watching and attending the Orioles and Ravens games. He had a very funny yet distinct chuckle which we will not forget.

He was a quiet and private person in his faith which took him through his health challenges. He would always respond to the many prayers and encouragements that his family shared. It not only helped him, but it helped the family that attended to his needs.

It was God's amazing grace that took him through some very difficult days. With much love and dedication, his family always worked to make sure that his medical and nursing care was maintained. He often would express his appreciation through a smile, a grunt, or the movement of his hands when he could not talk. He never complained or showed discontent due to his peace in the Most High.
