REGONIS ADAMS "REGGIE" HARRISON, beloved daughter of the late John Quincy Adams and Dessie Floyd Adams, was born September 19, 1920 in Baltimore, Maryland. She entered into eternal rest early Sunday morning, August 3, 2014 at Northwest Hospital.

Reggie (as she was so lovingly called by family and friends) attended Baltimore City Public Schools, graduating from Frederick Douglass High School in 1939. After high school, Reggie attended The Cortez Peters' Business School, then located on the corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and Dolphin Street. Graduating from Cortez Peters was a source of great pride for her, and proved to be her launch into a long and satisfying career with the Federal Government. Starting first with the Social Security Administration, then as a civilian employee with the Department of the Army at Fort George G. Meade, she finished her 37-year career with the Federal government back again working for the Social Security Administration. After her retirement, Reggie worked briefly as a Driver's Aide on the very same Baltimore County school bus her husband Bob drove after his retirement. Three years later, she finally decided to enjoy her remaining years with family and friends, often traveling and camping with Bob and her granddaughter Shawntel.

On August 5, 1950, Reggie and Robert Stephen Eric Harrison were united in Holy Matrimony. Of that union one child was born, a son, Eric Stephen Harrison, Sr.

Regonis is preceded in her journey home by three brothers, Floyd, Benton

and Herbert Adams. She is survived by: her son, Eric, Sr.; wonderful daughter-in-law, Shawn D. Harrison; two granddaughters, Shawntel and Guynan; four grandsons, Julian, Justin, Eric, Jr. and Adam; three great-granddaughters, Brooklyn, Jael, and Jahtana; three nephews, Grafton Adams, Herbert Adams and Neil Adams; niece, Brenda Swann Holmes; caring cousins, Brucie Brunson (and her daughter, Winetta Hopkins), Margarete Bradley and Deborah Wilkens; longtime friend and former neighbor, Edith Hinton; a host of other relatives and dear friends in Baltimore, Philadelphia, Detroit, and North and South Carolina.
