Renaldo James Robinson, son of the late Deborah and Lawrence Robinson, was born on July 1, 1957, in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on June 3, 2005, while in the arms of his loving wife. Fondly known as "Big Rob," he clung to his life until his wife whispered, "We'll be alright, honey. You can go home." Renaldo was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. He graduated from Northwestern Senior High School in 1975. An exceptional student, Renaldo received a scholarship to attend Morgan State College, majoring in Commercial Art. After two years at Morgan, Renaldo decided to try his hand at other opportunities. Renaldo met the love of his life, Sharon, at First Christian Community Baptist Church. They were introduced by his young cousin, Darrell Riley, following a Sunday morning service. Renaldo and Sharon were inseparable. In 1983, Renaldo gave his life to God and joined First Christian Community Baptist Church. Renaldo and Sharon were married on June 9, 1984. Renaldo loved to work and take care of his family. He was employed by the Social Security Administration in 1982. In 1985, he began employment as a correctional officer at the Baltimore City Jail in 1986. Through the years, Renaldo was faced with many medical challenges, which led to his early retirement in 1995. In typical Renaldo style, instead of complaining, he became a "Super Dad." He helped the kids get ready for school, cleaned the house, had dinner on the table by 6:00 p.m., and made sure that the kids completed their homework. Renaldo was blessed with many gifts, including cooking, writing, upholstery, landscaping, art and acting.

Renaldo loved to act in plays and dramatizations for Black History Month. His most noted performance was in the Christian play, "The Great White Throne." Renaldo character, "Big Daddy Rich" was a flamboyant, "over the top," character that always stole the show. Renaldo was an avid sports fan and loved debating who was the better athlete with his friends. Renaldo was a "man's man" who loved life, but most of all he loved his wife, Sharon, daughter, Remira, and his son Renaldo Jr. Renaldo never missed a music recital, a baseball game, or any of his children's school activities. He was a stickler for promoting academic excellence and was proud of his son who made the "National Who's Who List of High School Students" in 2004. Renaldo was very protective of his only sister, Senora. Oh, how he loved her. Aunt Gottie was like a mother to him. He grew up with Gottie's children, so they were like his sisters and brothers. Renaldo loved to wear the finest clothes and strut with his beautiful wife and children in tow. When "Big Man" got dressed, everything had to be color coordinated down to his shoes. He loved to travel, even when his health began to decline; however, he was determined to enjoy his family. There was no pretense about Renaldo - "What you see is what you get." Renaldo was always Renaldo. He was a confident, outspoken man who, if asked a question, would give you a direct and honest response. It was classic Renaldo to give you that look, with those big, hazel eyes. He didn't have to say a word, but you got your answer. Renaldo loved to praise the Lord and found comfort in His word He sang on a number of choirs including the Humphrey Choral Ensemble, the Mass Choir and the Male Chorus. Renaldo's favorite song was his solo, "Falling in Love With Jesus." In addition, he was an officer of the trustee board and an active member on many church committees. He appreciated the simple things in life such as God's natural beauty - the colors amid the sunrise and the trees of autumn that peer through the mountains. Yes, he loved and lived life to its fullest.
