RENNARD “NODDY” ANTHONY WALKER was born on August 29, 1950 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Nathaniel Obie Walker Sr. and Delores Sylvia Kent Walker. After contending with a lengthy illness, Rennard was called home to be with the Lord on April 17, 2013.

Noddy, the second oldest of six children, was preceded in death by his father, Nathaniel O. Walker Sr.; his sister, Irene Dawkins; his two brothers, Larry A. Walker and Nathaniel O. his final career change to Quest International Flavors; where he worked the majority of his later years until his retirement.

When Noddy united with Jackie, he also united with her family, who embraced and loved him as their own. Out of their union they were blessed with three daughters, Russia, Shantay and Crystal; and one son, Keith.
