



## Rev. Dr. Floyd James Willis,

July 26, 1945 - January 6, 2010

Rev. Dr. Floyd Willis, Jr., was born on July 26, 1945 to Julia Winston Willis and the late Floyd J. Willis, Sr. of Goochland County, Virginia. He departed this life Wednesday, January 6, 2010 after a brief illness. On August 11, 1959, Rev. Willis accepted Christ and joined the Emmaus Baptist Church. He was ordained as a deacon of the church on November 4, 1970. On July 1, 1977, he accepted his call to the gospel ministry. On January 1, 1978, he preached his trail sermon at the church, and received his ministry license. He received his Certificate of Ordination in 1979 and started to further his education. In 1990, he received his Doctor of Theology from Triune Biblical University. He went on to obtain an additional doctorate in Biblical and Christian Counseling in 1991 and 1992 respectively. Rev. Willis was the former pastor of Rock of Faith Full Gospel Ministries, and during his lifetime, owned and operated several profitable businesses, most recently an independently owned trucking operation. He was preceded in death by his father, Floyd Willis, Sr., and his sister Elizabeth Randolph. He is survived by his wife, Darlene; children, Pamela Rucker (Arthur) of Texas, Cassandra Boxley, Benita Harvey, Kimberly Blackman (Robert) of Alabama, and Lynette Baptiste (Jay), children by marriage, Jasmine, Damien and Ja'kari; grandchildren, Montique, Chadrea, Marquis, Calvin, Christopher, Justin, Eva Kei' Ashia; great-grandchildren, Chamoni, Marquis Jr., and Danasia; mother, Julia; brother and sisters, Gwendolyn Coles (Major), Edward, Vivian, Kelvin, and Gail Minor (Reggie); a devoted brother-

in-law, Thomas Randolph of Washington, DC; mother-in-law, Luoise Jackson and a host of other nephews, nieces, cousins, in-laws and friends.
