



Reynard Allen Black

August 2, 1961 - February 5, 2018

Reynard Allen Black, Sr. "Rennie", 56 of Charles City, Virginia passed away peacefully surrounded by his family at home on February 5, 2018, after a courageous 4-year battle with Liposarcoma. He was preceded in death by his father, Thomas R. Black Sr., and brother, Thomas R. Black, Jr.

Rennie confessed his love for Jesus at an early age, and joined Parrish Hill Baptist Church, where he served as a trustee, member of the senior and volunteer choirs, and frequently assisted the youth programs. He was guided by his love for God and his Christian faith. His family was important to him, and he cherished many vacations and celebrations throughout his years with them.

Rennie was an avid outdoors-man; he enjoyed swimming, running, working in his yard, and spending time with his family. He was a certified grill master, and was always on grill duty at his family cookouts. He was the anchor of his family, and was the person they'd call on for help no matter how large or difficult the task. He was notorious for strategic thinking and analyzing processes to ensure minimal to no re-work, and in the end everyone would be thoroughly pleased with the result.

Rennie served in the United States Army for six years as a Calvary Scout, and achieved numerous medals and awards. He dedicated 28 years to The Naval Weapons Station Yorktown, working as an explosives technician, fire fighter, and fire inspector. After retirement, he took his talents to Charles City Public Schools, serving as a transportation expert, earning him an official job title as

"The Bus Driver" as he was affectionately nick-named by his loving niece Latisha Brown. The Bus Driver gained a new support group consisting of not only faculty and staff of the school system, but also the students that he picked up along his bus route.

Rennie leaves to cherish his loving memory: his soulmate of 29 years, Wilhelmenia B. Black; sons, Reynard Jr. and Wesley Black; mother, Emma J. Black; sister, Tracey Jones (Ricky); brother, Clyde Black, Sr.; mother-in-law, Arlene N. Brown; three sisters-in-law, Willie Ann Otey (Waddell), Nina B. Friend and Brenda Black; three brothers-in-law, William (Joyce) James, and Carlton (Hope) Brown; two godchildren, David Jones, Jr. and Kayla Otey. Rennie also leaves behind a large network of other loving family members and friends, including two devoted, Floyd "Big Daddy" Bowman and Michael Boyd. He was well known for his humorous quote, "You is Terrible", knowing full well the grammar was all wrong.

Liposarcoma

Rennie was diagnosed as having a soft tissue sarcoma in May 2014 that would be later known as Liposarcoma. Liposarcoma is a soft tissue cancer that occurs in the muscles, bones, nerves, and other connective tissue. Within the United States, around 11,000 people are diagnosed, comprising less than 1% of adult's cancers and 21% of children's cancers. Throughout his fight, he touched many lives and found out God's purpose in choosing him to battle this rare disease.

Liposarcomas are rare, and Rennie's case was especially unique in that his first tumor grew to be 16 pounds in size and was deemed in-operable. It was at this point that Rennie began the fight of his life. Ren shared with all interested that he placed his hands on his stomach and talked to God about it. He acknowledge to God that the diagnosis was too big for him and he was releasing it to him promising he would follow God through this journey and that's just what he did.

The results of the tumor type, stage, and grade determines how the sarcoma

will be treated, nearly resulting in almost all cases requiring surgery due to the fact that there is no other known cure. The more advanced cases may require patients to be treated with radiation therapy and/or chemotherapy to slow the growth of the tumors.

Rennie was referred to Dr. Brian J. Kaplan of VCU Health Center, well known for his expertise in sarcoma surgeries and highly recommended because he was considered the only doctor in the Central Virginia Region that could "possibly" remove the tumor. It was a few months after the diagnosis that God's Grace and Mercy stepped in and Dr. Kaplan informed Rennie that he would remove the tumor, but warned there was a possibility he could lose some or partial other organs. During these types of cases, it is important for the patient to have a strong support system because the intensity, side effects, and duration of the treatment can be disheartening and challenging. Rennie had a dynamic support system comprised of family, friends, co-workers, neighbors and his community.

Rennie was determined to share his story with everyone, not just knowledge about the disease but the fact for him there was no cure. He wanted people to know about CANCER because he was not only devastated but clueless as to what he could have done to prevent it. He would later learn in 2016 that his soft tissue sarcoma had now been identified as Liposarcoma. The symptoms don't surface for quite some time because the disease hides itself in the soft tissues. Rennie was a warrior, and he never took a day for granted. He recognized that each day is a gift from God. He was very positive about his treatments and was never heard complaining or having anger nor resentment for what was happening to his body.

VCU Health asked Rennie if he would donate his tumor for research and he gladly signed the papers. He told them he wanted to help the next person and although there was not curative medicine for him perhaps the research would enable them to one day find a cure. Rennie had a awesome team of doctors, nurses, care partners and lab technicians. Most notably his Oncologist, Dr.

Andre Poklepovic, who tried relentlessly to find a cure for not only Rennie but others that would one day too be faced with this dreaded disease.

The VCU Health team was fantastic; Rennie received white-glove treatment for the course of two years, with doctors on call, and inpatient treatment hospital stays. Unfortunately, in 2016, two years after having his initial 16 pound tumor removed, a new set of growth formed and began growing in his abdomen. He tried numerous chemotherapy drugs, clinical trials, and even radiation therapy. After none of those treatments were successful in shrinking or killing the tumors, these too were also successfully removed, and after healing from surgery, Rennie was able to return to his day to day activities.. In November of 2017, Rennie's tumors had returned once again, with a vengeance. This time, he was treated with an immunotherapy drug in an attempt to finally find a successful cure. Unfortunately, this treatment was also unsuccessful at shrinking his tumors, and they grew very rapidly, consuming his entire abdomen within a few weeks' time. Rennie lost this battle on February 5, 2018 at 6:45 p.m., but gained his wings and fulfilled his promise to God to follow him all the way.

Through it all, his loving and devoted soulmate was by his side every step of the way. They went to his appointments together, and were also side by side while receiving treatments. Rennie was courageous and in the midst of his battle. He also built up strength to support his wife Menia at her appointments after her breast cancer diagnosis. His faith and trust in God helped not only himself, but his entire family endure a long four year battle with this detrimental diagnosis. We will continue to pray for a cure, and have hope that through research, science, and prayer, there will one day be a cure for Liposarcoma. Rennie's last wish would be to encourage loved ones to support family members and friends who may be diagnosed with any type of terminal illness. No one deserves to fight alone, and the presence of family and friends during these times is essential to maintaining a positive state of mind.

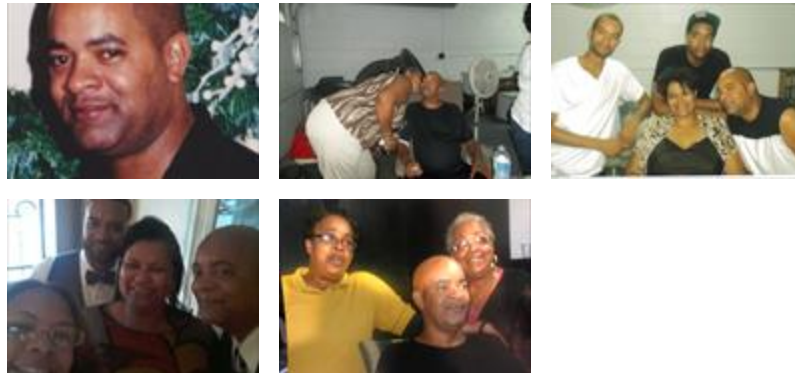
