Rhodie Lane Middleton was born on October 18, 1933 in Williamsburg County, South Carolina, daughter of the late James and Eliza Brown. She succumbed to death on July 6, 2020. On August 8, 1955, Rhodie married her loving, devoted husband, Arthur Benjamin Middleton and out of that union had three children, Louis, Thomas, and Barbara. Rhodie and Arthur were married for 59 years before Arthur departed his life on May 18, 2015. Rhodie was also preceded in death by her two sons, Louis B. Middleton, Sr. and Thomas N. Middleton.

She attended nursing school and became a licensed practical nurse (LPN). After marrying and starting her family, she moved from South Carolina to Baltimore, Maryland and found work as a nurse at Johns Hopkins Hospital from 1958 until retirement in 1995.

Rhodie had a deep love for spiritual things. She studied the Bible and was baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses on May 5, 1990. For eight of those years, she "pioneered," devoting many hours each month in the Bible preaching and teaching work. She was known to be regular in the ministry.

Her fine example influenced her children who also strongly valued spiritual things and enjoyed many spiritual privileges.

Rhodie had a very kind, gentle, quiet but strong spirit that was reflected in her interests and her relationships with others. Some of Rhodie's interests included gardening. She loved planting and nurturing her beautiful flowers and plants. At home, her family loved her cooking southern foods and keeping the family tradition of Sunday dinners. Rhodie also cherished her relationships with her family in the South as well as her spiritual brothers and sisters in her congregation. For 38 years she lovingly took care of her grandson, Louis Jr., who has autism, by providing respite for his parents.

Rhodie is survived by her devoted daughter, Barbara Middleton and one grandson, Louis B. Middleton, Jr.; two daughters-in-law, Joyce Middleton and Mischelda Middleton of Baltimore, MD; two brothers, James [Rebecca] Brown of Salters, SC and Daniel [Roberta] Brown of Kingstree, SC; two sisters, Carrie [Cleo] Lee of Charleston, SC and Stella Griffin of Kingstree, SC; and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and very dear and intimate friends who will all miss her greatly.
