Rhudeen Evangelis Loftin, only daughter to the late Rev. Willie Weston Wine and Rosa Wine, was born Rhudeen Evangelis Goodwine on December 27, 1924 in Fort Motte, South Carolina. She was called home on November 28, 2002 after an extensive illness. She was the only child to attend the Fort Motte community schools in South Carolina until she was blessed with an adopted brother, Jack Wine, who later joined her in the struggles of segregation in the south. Rhudeen later moved to Baltimore in the late 1960's where she worked as a seamstress at Misty Harbor for over thirty years until she retired. She devoted the rest of her life as a faithful Christian member and usher at the New Elizabeth Baptist Church in Baltimore. She married the late Woodrow Loftin, and out of this union came a son. She was loved, respected and admired by all that knew her. She enjoyed growing her own fruits and vegetables, making ceramics, cooking and sewing for her family. Rhudeen always had a "classy" style and a loving smile. She will be truly missed.
