RICHARD BURROWS was born on April 27, 1935 to Jacob Burrows and Daisy Cunningham-Burrows in Kingtree, South Carolina. He was blessed to grow up in a loving family of fifteen siblings. His eight brothers, Bennie, Wally, Nelson, Jessie, Laurie, Paul, Albert and Alvis, and four of his sisters, Rosa, Viola, Sadie, Evelyn preceded him in death.

Richard was educated in the Kingtree, South Carolina Public School System. He married Clara Smith who preceded him in death. From this union, three beautiful children were born, Martine' Yvonne, Pierre Lipton (who preceded him in death) and Yolanda Darlena. He transitioned from this life on Tuesday, May 23, 2017 in his home at 1:40 PM.

Brother Richard loved church and he loved God. He was baptized in the Name of Jesus and glad to be saved. He was grateful for the grace and mercy that God extended to him and would often say, "God is good." He shared his testimony with a smile before his death. He dedicated himself to ministry serving with his wife, Pastor Clara Burrows at Apostolic Church of Jesus Christ under the leadership of the late Bishop Alfred Wallace, Sr. He encouraged and supported building fund events to build the new church edifice on Kavanaugh Street. He continued his service at Inner Court Ministries under the leadership of Bishop Jonathan Wallace, Sr. He gladly served on the Shepherd's Care Ministry with his sister, Mother Magalena Sanders.

Richard was a man of vision. Whatever he began, he knew how to make it great. At the age of 16, an adventurous and eager young man, Richard moved from South Carolina to Baltimore, Maryland where he worked in construction. He expanded his horizons and began his career at Goucher College where he dedicated thirty-seven (37) years. Richard first began working in Goucher's Facilities Management Service Department. He later worked in the transportation department. He served as chauffeur to the college president. He also provided transportation for students as they traveled from the college president. Richard was often praised for his culinary skills. He distinguished himself as an outstanding, but humble, soul food chef. His minced barbeque, ribs and sweet tea were infamous. On the weekends when Richard worked, the campus was the most exciting place to be. His co-workers and the campus staff at Goucher loved his food so much that he was often booked to cater private events at their homes.

Mr. Richard, as he was affectionately called, was disgusted and stylish dresser. His personality was beautiful inside and out. He was man with a heart of gold. If he could, he would feed the world. Moreover, his word was his bond. He was never one to stand still. He was a multi-talented hard worker and used all of his gifts and talents to support his family and help anyone in need. As his life progressed, he made serious strides to get even closer to God.
