He donated to the Handicapped League and the American Kidney Foundation while waiting valiantly for a kidney transplant.

Richard loved all of his family and enjoyed a quiet and peaceful life at the Weinberg Manor Apartments in the Park Heights until his passing. He looked up to his last surviving brother. They talked daily ending each conversation, "OK big brother I love you;" "OK little brother I love you too."
