



Ringgold Dorsey Jr.

December 24, 1928 - August 31, 2012

Ringgold Dorsey, Jr. was born on December 24, 1928 in Baltimore, Maryland, the only child of the late Ringgold Dorsey, Sr. and the late Marjorie V. Matthews Dorsey.

Ringgold spent his childhood in Catonsville, Maryland. He attended the Banneker School in Baltimore, County and was a member of the Boy Scouts of America.

As a young man, Ringgold was employed by the United States Merchant Marines, which afforded him an opportunity to travel the world for several years. This was an experience that he greatly enjoyed and talked about until his death. Ringgold served in the U.S. Army from 1953 until 1955. After his discharge, he returned to Maryland where he was employed by the U.S. Postal Service. Ringgold retired from the Postal Service in 1985, after 31 years of service.

On August 2, 1959, Ringgold was married to the late Mollie C. Acree Dorsey and they were blessed with one daughter, Deborah.

Following his retirement, Ringgold became an avid bowler. He also enjoyed traveling, attending jazz concerts and spending time with friends and family.

In 1994 Ringgold decided to renew his faith and was baptized at Good Shepherd Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland where he served as a member of the Missionary Auxiliary. He later became a member of Morning Star Baptist Church in his hometown of Catonsville, Maryland.

Ringgold is survived by his daughter, Deborah Ann Carter; son-in-law, Christopher Carter; granddaughter, Christina N. Carter; cousins, Ann Dorsey, Cheryl Cromwell, Mr. & Mrs. William and Dianne Dorsey, Patricia Smith, and Paul, Charles, Robert, Diane and Thomas Dorsey; long-time friends Deloris Grey, Mr. & Mrs. Anthony and Debra Thomas and their sons, Evan and Vance, and many loving relatives and friends.
