



## Rita O. Robinson

May 5, 1955 - December 26, 2018

On December 26, 2018, Rita Robinson, was called home to the Lord. Rita Olivia Robinson (Moss), daughter of Harriet Leigh (Moss) and Marion Moss was born on May 5, 1955 in Washington, DC. With a military father she lived in Alaska, Kansas, and Frankfurt, Germany before her family settled in Colorado Springs, CO. There she attended Mitchell High School and graduated in 1973.

In Colorado Springs, she met her husband Jerry Robinson, in 1975 who was in the U.S. Army stationed at Fort Carson. They married in January of 1977 and celebrated 41 years together. In 1979 Rita gave birth to her first daughter Kenesha Nicole in Houston, TX and eight years later gave birth to her second daughter Tiara Chanel in Pirmasens, Germany.

After an eight-year tour in Europe, she and her family moved back to the Washington, DC Area eventually settling in Upper Marlboro, Maryland. While in the Washington, DC Area Rita was a member of Glendale Baptist Church, which then became The Sanctuary at Kingdom Square, under the leadership of Pastor Anthony G. Maclin.

While in the DC Metro area she continued to work as a Department of the Army Civilian working at Ft. Belvoir and then The Human Resource Management Directorate (HRMD) of the Office of the Administrative Assistant

to the Secretary of the Army (OAA). Rita served as civil servant working for the Department of the Army for thirty-three years retiring in 2015 as a GS-14, Human Resources Deputy.

After her retirement in 2015, Rita and Jerry settled in Buford, GA to enjoy their retirement years in warm weather and Southern sunshine. While in Georgia she attended Saint James United Methodist Church where she served as part of the Hospitality Committee as a Greeter and joined the Black Girls who Brunch social group with her daughter, Tiara. She spent her retirement years travelling, visiting art museums, and cultural events in the Atlanta area with the love of her life, Jerry Robinson.

Rita was preceded in death by her father, Marion Moss; sister, Linda Moss Hefner; and grandmother, Ruby Leigh.

She is survived by her husband, Jerry Robinson; daughters, Kenesha Williams and Tiara Robinson; mother, Harriet Moss; two brothers, Anthony Moss and Bruce Moss; grandchildren, Hassan, Na'im and Zahir Williams; mother-in-law, Mary Grazes; one brother-in-law; four sisters-in-law and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends who loved her dearly.
