March 8, 1935 - May 15, 2018

ROBERT LENWOOD BROWN, was born to Jeff and Clara Alston Brown on March 8, 1935 in Littleton, North Carolina. He later moved with his family to Steelton, Pennsylvania, where he completed his early and high school years of education in the Steelton School District. He was active in the community Boy Scouts and the Steelton Church where he sang on the choir. In high school he was an outstanding athlete, excelling in football and basketball, where he earned his nickname “Big Brown” because of his height and his skills in both football and basketball. He also learned to play tennis during high school and enjoyed playing after graduating and throughout his adult life. His nickname to family and friends became “Len”, a shorter form of his middle name, “Lenwood”. Len loved music! He had a passion for music! Jazz was his favorite! Miles Davis topped his list of favorite Jazz artists. He also loved ballads and the most popular soul artists. He owned an extensive collection of these types of music. After high school he joined the Army, fulfilling his responsibilities and commitment to the military. After returning to civilian life he was employed at the steel mill in Steelton, Pennsylvania. By then most of his family lived in the Baltimore-Washington area. Len visited Baltimore often on weekends to see his family, sometimes staying over with his Uncle Willis and Aunt Sallie and Len’s cousins who were his age and had similar interests. One weekend one of his cousins introduced

him to a friend of hers named Alma Walker, she later became Len's wife. From that marriage, two sons were born, Kevin and Kennard (Kenny). They settled in Baltimore. Len is survived by his sons, Kevin D. Brown and Kennard L. Brown (Kenny); his sister, Elizabeth Scott; and many other family members and friends.
