Mike had a quiet spirit about him, very humble and meek and a strong and personal relationship with God. He was always soft-spoken, unassuming, faithful, dependable and honest. He was a great brother and very protective to his sisters and brothers. He was a very giving uncle to his nephews and a dedicated worker to his co-workers and supervisors.
