And from this work he learned the streets and all the basics of life and survival. That led to his involvement in the Police Boys Club recreation center at Gold and Calhoun Streets. There he developed a passion for amateur boxing and thus his nickname "rough-house". Robert, affectionately called Bobby, won many titles and trophies for his skills as a boxer. For most of his adult life he would demonstrate his 'foot shuffle and punch and jab' techniques to the amazement of everyone. Young boys admired him.
