Robert Edward McIver, the son of the late Joseph Edward and Minnie Worthy-McIver, was born February 8, 1920 in Sanford, North Carolina. He departed this life on Saturday, March 5, 2005. Rob or Mac (short for McIver), as he was affectionately called by friends and family, was educated in the McIver School in Lemon Springs, North Carolina. He attended Sunday School at the New Hope Methodist Church where he was baptized. At a young age, Rob traveled to Baltimore, Maryland. He was employed by Potts and Callahan Contractors for a short spell before continuing on to work for the B and O Railroad. Rob enlisted in the United States Army in 1943. He served as a Military Police Officer during W.W.II. He was honorably discharged in 1945; shortly and thereafter, he moved to Brooklyn, New York. He spent most of his adult life in New York working for the London Restaurant Company and the Brooklyn Business School, from which he retired in 1994. Rob was industrious and demonstrated his entrepreneurial skills by owning and being the proprietor of several small businesses, a gas station and second hand shop. Rob moved to Baltimore in 1997, when his health began to fail. After living with his sister Effie, niece Candy, and finally by himself, Rob had to abdicate his independence and move to a nursing home facility. Though his confinement to a nursing home was a change for him, Rob adjusted and looked forward to the visits from his family, especially his niece Shirly. The staff at Dulaney Valley Towson Manor Care, where he resided, became part of his extended family and they affectionately called him Uncle Rob. Rob believed that life is

like a coin. You can spend it any way you want, but you can only spend it once. Rob leaves to mourn his passing: two sisters, Effie Hall of Baltimore, Maryland and Odessa Stewart of Brooklyn, New York. He has a large number of nieces, nephews, great and great great, along with cousins and a host of other relatives and friends. He also leaves a devoted friend, Catherine of Brooklyn, New York.
