Robert Gilbert Zant was born the eighth child of the late Aleathea and James Thomas on November 19, 1934. Robert or 'Bobby", as he was called by family, was adopted by Bessie and Julius Caesar Zant. He became accustomed to hard work on the Zant farm in Pasadena, Maryland. He rose early to feed livestock and plow fields with his siblings. He was raised in the word and attended church with his family. After high school, Robert joined the U.S. Marines. His tour of duty took him to Japan after WWII where he learned to speak Japanese. The military also taught him to bake. He was known for making delicious baked goods and beautiful cakes. Robert was married on December 17, 1960 to the late Juanita Glover Zant. From this union a daughter, Vanessa was born. Robert rededicated his life to the Lord and became a minister in May 1984. In 1985, he completed a B.S. in ministry from A.E.W. Institute. He was later elevated to Bishop. Robert quietly departed this life on June 6, 2009 after a long illness. Left to cherish his memory are; daughters, Vanessa and Vermel; four sisters, Hazel, Grace, Roberta and Jeanette; five brothers, James, George, Webster, William Russell and Albert; his companion, Theresa; other relatives and friends.
