February 2, 1916 - December 12, 2004

Robert Hudson Clark, Sr., son of Robert Banks Clark and Marie Leola Hudson, was born on February 2, 1916 in Roanoke, VA. Saul, as he was affectionately called by "his boys" departed this life on Sunday, December 12, 2004. He received his education at Pulaski High School in Pulaski, VA and the Tuskegee Institute. He worked as an orderly at the local hospital before becoming employed at the Radford Ordnance Plant twenty-five miles away in Radford, Virginia. Robert met his wife-to-be Ozenn Holt of Lester's Gate, Virginia in 1938. He moved to Baltimore in 1943. Robert and Ozenn were married in Washington, D.C. on March 25, 1944 and lived in Baltimore where they had two sons, Robert and John. Robert Sr. is remembered as a love of jazz and sports; especially baseball and boxing. He often spoke of watching Negro League Baseball games on Baltimore. In August 8, 1952, he began working at Bethlehem Steel, four days after the birth of his youngest, John, and retired twenty-six years later. He leaves to mourn: his wife, Ozenn H.
