ROBERT LYNN BOWEN was born on February 4, 1936 in East Arcadia, North Carolina to the late Sanford and Henrietta Bowen. He was the seventh of nine children. Unexpectedly, on the morning of Tuesday, July 3, 2007, he was called home. Robert made the transition from an old to a new and better life. Robert (affectionately known as “Link” or “Bob” to friends, family, and peers) was educated in the East Arcadia public schools. He graduated in 1955 and headed to Baltimore for better job opportunities. It was in Baltimore that he met his beloved Carolyn. On October 12, 1958, Robert joined Carolyn L. Stevenson in holy matrimony at Perkins Square Baptist Church, located in Baltimore, Maryland. To this union three children were born: Karen Louise, Kimberly Lynette and Robert Charles. When Bob came to Baltimore, he found employment at Sealtest Dairy, then moved to Koontz Creamery. On January 20, 1969, he began a career at McCormick and Co., which was then located at Light St. When McCormick moved to Hunt Valley, Bob went with them. On January 1, 1995, he retired from the Hunt Valley Condiment Plant. During his long career, he rose to the position of second shift supervisor. He was also the president and a valuable member of the Sugar and Spice Bowling League. After several years of retirement, Bob worked at Almost Family Adult Care. As a driver, he transported disabled clients to various activities. In 1997, Bob joined the Falls Road A.M. E. Church. Bob loved his church family and was a faithful servant who trusted in the Lord at all times. Robert leaves behind a strong legacy and precious memories to be cherished by his loved ones:
