ROBERT LEROY LEMASTER, affectionately known as “Bobby,” departed this life on Thursday evening, February 15, 2007 at approximately 9:45 p.m. at home after a brief but intense struggle with lung cancer. He was born in Cambridge, Ohio but moved to Union, West Virginia at a young age. Robert was educated in the public schools of Montgomery, West Virginia. He was a hardworking man and in 1997, he retired from the Chesapeake Metal Company as a machinist. It was in early April 1953 that he met the love of his life, Annie Lee Jefferson. After a very brief courtship, they were married on May 2, 1953. They maintained this love and marriage for almost fifty-four years. Annie’s family became Robert’s family in that he adopted Annie’s daughter, Correan, and helped to raise Annie’s younger sisters, Rosetta and Alma, as his own children. An avid lover of sports and current events, Robert spent much of his retirement time reading, listening to the radio, watching television, and sharing knowledge gained with his family. He enjoyed walking through the neighborhood and often to Mondawmin mall to spend time with the other men in the barbershop.
