Robert Moton Lockley passed away quietly in his sleep on January 9, 2020 after a short illness. He was the youngest of four children born to John Henry Lockley and Susan Moody in Capahosic, Gloucester Virginia July 19, 1927. Robert's grade school education was in the Gloucester School System. At the age of nine he moved to Baltimore where he entered the Baltimore City Public School System and graduated from Frederick Douglas High School in January 1946. In March of the same year he entered the Army, where he rose to the rank of Corporal. He was honorably discharged in 1949. Robert began working for the United States Postal Service in 1954. He retired from the Main Branch as a Director after 32 years of service.

When Robert first moved to Baltimore, he lived on Park Avenue. There he met lifelong friends Vivian, Madge and Alease, the young lady that would catch his eye and capture his heart. He married Alease Blanche Carr on June 27, 1954. They had a beautiful marriage. Not only were they spouses, they were best friends. He affectionately called her "A" and she was truly the love of his life. Robert and Alease enjoyed taking cruises, playing pinochle with friends, bowling, and spending time with family. From this union the couple was blessed with 3 children, Wayne T., Bobby, and Debbie. Alease preceded Robert in death June 24, 2004, 3 days shy of their 50th Wedding Anniversary. It would be 8 years before Robert found another companion, Modestino Cox. Ms. Moe, as she is affectionately known, brought life back into his world. She kept him moving, whether it was to formal dances, vacations or just going out

to eat.

Robert became a member of Heritage United Church of Christ more than 30 years ago and was an active member within the church up to the time of his illness. He was a member of the Khayyamites, a men's organization, where he served as Recording Secretary for many years and chaired several committees. He also enjoyed coaching baseball with the Forest Park Little League for many years.

Robert went by many names...Dad, Mr. Bobby, Bobby, Uncle Robert, and Pop Pop, by his friends, neighbors and family. He was truly a man of faith, wisdom and patience. He was a great man. He was a friend, a mentor, a great father, and a gentleman.
