September 12, 1934 - August 9, 2003

Robert Strathmore Brown was a native of Charles Town, West Virginia, born on September 12, 1934. He was the son of the late Mr. Robert and Mrs. Flora Brown. Robert Strathmore Brown was a product of the Jefferson County Public School System and a graduate of Jefferson County's first African American High School, Page Jackson High. As a graduate of Page Jackson High, Robert was the first to be the recipient of a full football scholarship to Fort Valley State College in Fort Valley, Georgia. As an all-star athlete and lettered football player, Robert Strathmore was also inducted into Sigma Phi Beta Fraternity. Robert Strathmore Brown was an employee with the United States Postal System for thirty-four years. His final position was Floor Supervisor. In nineteen-ninety two, Robert retired from the postal system after years of dedicated service. Because he had a tremendous love for sports and the outdoors, he was an avid fisherman and a total sports fan. As an employee of the postal system, Robert Strathmore participated in their softball team and bowling league. He faithfully and humbly served as a member in good standing with the Prince Hall Masons, Mount Lebanon Lodge Number Twenty-Two. There he served on the Sick and Shut-In Committee. Robert Strathmore Brown was joined together in Holy Matrimony to the former Ms. Willette T. Bush on October 5, 1955. From their union of forty-seven years were born Paul Gary, Stephen Renee, Sandra Lorraine and Eric Von Brown. He was a member of the Saint Phillips Episcopal Church in Charles Town, West Virginia. Most recently he became a Watch-Care Fellowship member at the Songs of

Praise Worship Center. After a short illness, Robert departed this life and went home to be with the Lord on August 9, 2003. Robert leaves to cherish his memories: his devoted wife Willette; four adult children, Paul, Stephen, Sandra and Eric; a brother Johnny; a half-brother Charles and a sister Betty; grandchildren, Corbette, Cynthia, Danial, Ashley and Danielle; two daughters-in-law, Kathy and Yong and a sister-in-law, Deloris; a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.

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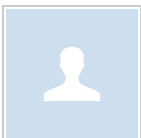
