



## Robert W. Cole

November 12, 1928 - January 7, 2009

Robert William Cole was born on November 12, 1928 to Robert A. Cole and Ruth Ellen Myers in Baltimore City. When he was nine years old, his mother relocated to Linthicum Heights, Maryland where he attended school. He served in the U.S. Army from 1951 to 1953 active duty and four years in the reserves. He was honorably discharged in 1957. Robert began working for U.S. Civil Service at Fort Meade in 1953 and continued until retiring in December of 1989. He met Barbara Adams in September 1953. They married April 10, 1954. That union produced six children, four surviving (three sons and one daughter). Robert was very active in the community, especially where young people were concerned. He spent years volunteering as a part-time employee for the Bureau of Recreation and Parks. As a result of his dedication he was given a Channel 13 Salute ceremony. Also, Mayor William Donald Schaefer designated October 4, 1981 as "Robert W. Cole Day" in Baltimore. He leaves to mourn; his wife of fifty-four years, Barbara; three sons, Michael, Anthony and Steven, and one daughter, Robin; daughter-in-law, Rhonda; five grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, five sisters, one brother, four brothers-in-law three sisters-in-law, and a host of nieces, nephews and other relatives.
