Roberta Jones, daughter of the late Joseph and Rosanna Prince Thomas was born on December 1, 1928 in Harnett County, North Carolina.

Roberta was the youngest of 18 children. She was educated in North Carolina. Her mother died when she was only 3 years old. Her dad and siblings raised her. They taught her how to cook and work in the field.

Roberta moved to Baltimore, Maryland at the age of 16. She met the love of her life her "Honey Dew" Patrick Jones. They were married 45 years until he preceded her in death on November 3, 2003. She and our dad had 15 children, 9 survived, but the youngest son (Robert) preceded her in death on January 5, 1993.

Roberta accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her Savior at an early age. We would often ask her making sure that if she would die today or tomorrow did she know where she would spend eternity? She said "yes, in heaven with the Lord Jesus Christ." We always sang hymns, her favorite was "What A Friend We Have In Jesus."

She worked several jobs, restaurants, housekeeping and at Memorial Stadium on 33rd Street, but her greatest job she loved most was taking care of her husband, children and her grandchildren when they came over. She also

helped raise some of her nieces and nephews. She really enjoyed cooking soul food, but her signature labels were the sweet potato pies and sticky apples, they were her children and neighbors favorite. She made sure that no one, visitor or family, left her house hungry. She would ask “Y’all want something to eat?” She would slip money to anyone, that’s how she was. She also would fight for her children when they were small, lol.

Roberta joined the New Second Baptist Church where the family was grounded in the Lord and cultivated their musical gifts. She later made the Philadelphia Christian Church her final church, where she was a member of the Seniors In Action Ministry until her untimely death.

She and dad took all of the children to church faithfully every Sunday when we were young. We would join our uncles and aunts and their children out at Druid Hill Park to have picnics right after church. She was a diamond and one of the most loved persons ever. We praise and thank the Lord for the life she lived.

Roberta leaves to cherish her memories: her one and only sister, Minnie Wells; three daughters, Teresa, Loretta and Carol; five sons, Melvin (Charlotte), Patrick (Isa), George, Tyrone (Joyce) and Joseph (Kim); four sisters-in-law, Virginia, Annie, Grace and Mary; 27 grandchildren, 37 great grandchildren, two great great grandchildren; and a host of other relatives and friends.

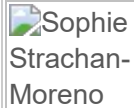
