November 18, 1915 - April 22, 2006

Roger T. Boney departed this life on Saturday, April 22, 2006. Born in Wayne County, South Carolina on November 18, 1915 to Livingston and Ida Boney, Roger was the third of three children. He moved to Baltimore with his parents at an early age and was a product of Baltimore City Schools, where he graduated from Dunbar High School. Upon graduation, Roger entered the United States Coast Guard in 1943 and traveled the world three times, visiting various ports of call such as China, Canada, South America, Russia, Africa and the Persian Gulf. He was honorably discharged from the Coast Guard in 1948. Mr. Boney was married twice, with his first married to Mary Guy ending in divorce in 1945. From this union, one child; a daughter, Annette Butler was born. Annette served as his primary caregiver until his death. Upon his discharge from the Coast Guard, he married Alice Freeman. She brought to the union two sons, Reginald and Gordon Conyers from a previous marriage. Reginald preceded them in death and Alice died in December 2004. Roger worked for the Social Security Administration for many years and retired in 1979. Upon his retirement, he became an avid jazz buff and a man about town. With wide range of music in his collection, ranging from Charlie Parker to Santana, he never missed a Sunday, at the Left Bank Jazz Society, and enjoyed a variety of social and cultural events. Before his death, he gave his life to Christ and became a devotee of prayer and meditation. Mr. Boney leaves to mourn, a daughter, Annette Butler and son, Gordon Conyers, both of Baltimore. A loving sister, Lenora Jones of Baltimore and a host of grand,

great grand and great great grandchildren along with many nieces, nephews and friends.
