Roland Switzer Mack, son of Audrey and the late Lawrence Mack, was born in Clifton Forge, Virginia on July 17, 1950. He departed this life on June 22, 2002 at the Veterans Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. He received his formal education at Covington High School and later completed his education in Washington, D.C. Roland was baptized at the Pine Street Baptist Church under the leadership of Dr. Reverend E. Waters in Covington, Virginia at the tender age of ten. Roland was married to the former Susan Halsey-Mack and to this union three children were born: Aric, Chantae' and Roland Mack.
